Greetings to one and all in these opening days of 2006.

Things to note

EHIC: Please remember to apply in adequate time for the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) which replaced the E111 medical form in 2004. One card is needed for every individual or member of the family. If a person is a holder of a medical card or a DPS scheme card application can be made online at 2www.ehic.ie An application form can also be downloaded from this site. Alternatively you local Health Board centre can provide the forms. The card is valid for two years. If you already have one, please check that it is still valid.

Helpers Forms: The situation with regard to HELPERS FORMS has vastly improved in the past two years but there is still work to be done. Again this pilgrimage year we are asking that the **LIST OF CARERS** be submitted to Kilcuan before January 31st and all **CARER FORMS AND FARES** be lodged with the office before **FEBRUARY 28TH 2006**. For administrative reasons group leaders are asked to adhere to these dates.

Moving and Handling: Another two people have now qualified as instructors to give courses in Moving and Handling for IHCPT. Thank you to those who have volunteered for this work. This means that we have five people qualified to provide the training that has been requested by our insurance company. Each group is required to have a number of people instructed in the correct procedures. This training will be provided at regional and group level. Please arrange for a number of your group to be available for this training.

Trust Directory: The Trust Directory is available on CD. Please notify the office of changes of address, phone numbers or email address.

Code of Practice: The Code of Practice is available from Kilcuan or on our website in pdf format: [ihcpt.com/code of practice](http://ihcpt.com/code_of_practice) Please make yourself aware of the contents of this book and take some time in the group to discuss the various protocols of IHCPT. A copy of the Code of Practice is sent to the family of each young person who travels with us to Lourdes or is part of a Friendship Week in Kilcuan.

Group Leaders' Manual: A working draft of the new edition of the Group Leaders' Manual will be available for each group leader in February. This book will contain vital information about the working of the Trust and will outline all protocols of IHCPT. It will be the working document for this year's pilgrimage and after further editing will be published later this year.

Headed Paper: Please make sure that all correspondence on behalf of the Trust is written on the up to date edition of headed paper. Please get rid of all old paper - the detail on the end of the paper is not accurate on the old paper.

Receipt Books: It is the policy of IHCPT that all money received at group, regional or national level is receipted using the IHCPT Receipt Book. Please make sure that all money is properly acknowledged with a note of thanks and a receipt. Please note also the requirement that at least two people count and prepare money for lodgement. Receipt books are available from HQ.

Im Memoriam: Please notify HQ of names of deceased young people, carers, group members and benefactors to be entered into the *Im Memoriam* book.

Irish Trust Talk: The February edition of the Irish Trust Talk is presently being prepared. Photos of your group in Lourdes or re-unions here in Ireland are always welcome. Please forward them on CD to Kilcuan or by email to editors@ihcpt.com



IHCPT BUILD IN THE SOUTH EAST

As you will know from previous newsletters IHCPT was successful in its application to the Dormant Accounts Fund for a grant to finance a proposed project in the South East. We are pleased that our request to the Charity Commissioners to proceed with this work was granted in October 2005.

We are now at an advanced stage with the planning. Thanks to all who replied to the letter with some very constructive suggestions which we have sought to include in the final plan. We have also now included an oratory and are working with Fergus Costello who designed the oratory in Kilcuan. Below are draft drawings that we are finalising at this time. The work should begin during the summer and the buildings ready for use in 2007. Below are drawings of the proposed development. It is an exciting development in this our 35th year.



Each house will have three bedrooms (A), a central living space (B) with a galley kitchen (C), two entrances: independent access to the grounds (D) and also interior access (E) to the central atrium (F). There will also be a kitchen designed for a group of 18 people (G).
