At our May meeting the Board of IHCPT marked the contribution of two members to the work of IHCPT.



In January 2004 Dr Michael McGloin completed his term as a member of the Board. Michael had been a member of the board since 1988 and during his fifteen years he was Trust Doctor, Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson. Michael has also organised the biennial IHCPT cycle to Lourdes. He has also been a member of Board of HCPT. As a thank you the Board presented Michael with an icon of the Madonna and Child. We thank him for his dedication and commitment to the Trust over the years and are pleased that he continues to give his time and talents to the Trust.



Angela Keane resigned from the Board in May 2004. A native of Kerry Angela completed five years as a member of the board. During her time there she worked to develop the merchandise aspect of IHCPT, opening and running a shop in Lourdes and co-ordinating the stock here in Ireland. We wish her well in what promises to be a very exciting future and look forward to seeing her in Lourdes.

## International Project

The board of IHCPT has become a partner with a project run by the Sisters of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary in El Salvador. Sister Anne Griffin was a member of HCPT Group 2 for many years when she was based in England. She is now working with a small project that is providing care for young children at risk in Arambala. We have agreed to provide funding for the work that Sr Anne's community is doing and our small annual contribution is enabling them to expand their work and provides them with the security of funding. Our funding will help the centre to provide training for a Care Worker and care for ten young people between the age of two and six years of age. # Things to note . . . . .

**E111:** On June 1st 2004 the E111 has been replaced by the European Health Insurance Card. One card is needed for every individual or member of the family. If a person is a holder of a medical card or a DPS scheme card application can be made online at [2www.ehic.ie](http://2www.ehic.ie). An application form can also be downloaded from this site. Alternatively your local Health Board centre can provide the forms. The process will take at least two weeks. This has implications for us and will require forward planning. More details at the September meeting.

**Helpers Forms:** As discussed at the Pre Pilgrimage meeting in Kilcuan this is an area of ongoing concern. In 2004 there was a vast improvement on the previous year but this still needs some work and energy. We are proposing that each group leader will have their list of cares submitted to Kilcuan before January 31st and all carer forms and fares lodged at the office before February 28th.

**Lifting and Handling:** In the latter end of 2004 we are arranging training for instructors in this area. If you are interested or know someone who might be interested please contact the office at Kilcuan. This person does not necessarily have to be someone who travels to Lourdes with us but is prepared to give a commitment to the Trust to provide training for our carers. This will be a valuable qualification for the person who takes this course and will enable us to provide training at seminars during the coming year.

**Trust Directory:** As usual the Trust Directory will be available on CD at the September meeting. Please notify the office of changes of address, phone numbers or email address. It is hoped that for the coming year the office will have an email address and mobile phone number for each group leader.

**Code of Practice:** A new edition of the Code of Practice will be available at the September Meeting. Please dispose of all old editions of the Code of Practice and make yourself aware of the contents of this book.

**Headed Paper:** IHCPT issued new headed paper at the pre pilgrimage meeting in March. Please make sure that all correspondence on behalf of the Trust is written on this paper. Please get rid of all old paper - the details on the end of the paper is not accurate on the old paper.

**Im Memoriam:** In our *Im Memoriam* book we entry the names of young people, carers, group members and benefactors who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. Please notify the HQ of names that should be entered into this book.
