Started by Pope St. John Paul II in 1992, all of 30 years ago, this day is an opportunity "for growth, with an attitude of listening, reflection, and effective commitment in the face of the great mystery of pain and illness".

Sickness more than anything can bring with it great fear, upset and a feeling of loss of control in our lives. Into this picture Jesus comes, assuring us of his love for us, his will for us, his ability to see a bigger picture.

It takes great faith to place ourselves in his hands, in his control, in his will, in his love for us; help us Lord to place our faith in you, in your love and devotion for us.

As we celebrate the healing power of God, we acknowledge our need of Your divine help:

Lord Jesus, you healed the sick ... Lord, have mercy

Lord Jesus, you forgave sinners ... Lord, have mercy

Lord Jesus, you gave us yourself to heal us and bring us strength: Lord, have mercy.

Homily for the Sick

Friday is the feast of "Our Lady of Lourdes" and is also the 30th anniversary of World Day of Prayer for the Sick.

Living with sickness in mind, body or spirit is a difficult and vulnerable journey that visits so many in all our families, friendships and community.

Sickness makes us vulnerable. When you have to live with serious illness you begin to realise that you are no longer in control.

We have to learn to hand it over to the Lord, that God's will be done in our lives.

That's not easy because our will doesn't always tally with God's will and sometimes we just cannot understand why?

So we have to have faith, we have to believe even when we cannot see.

We know God loves us and we have to learn to trust that He loves us and that He can see a bigger picture for us.

Sickness is a cross that is not just carried by the individual who has to suffer but is also felt greatly by their loved ones who often helplessly have to look on.

They too need to hand it over and again rely on faith in our loving God.

Jesus spent much time with the sick.

It was a fundamental priority for him to associate with those who were sick and wounded in life and his empathy meant a lot to the sick.

One of big statements that Jesus makes, regarding his mission, was that

"I HAVE COME NOT FOR THE HEALTHY BUT FOR THE SICK".

His carrying the cross to Calvary is the ultimate solidarity with those who suffer serious illness.

He invites us to place our burdens on his cross also.

I know that the Lord greatly loves and is very close to the sick.

He wants us to hand over our sickness, our troubles, our frailties; so that he can carry them for us

May all who are burdened by sickness be comforted and strengthened by God's rich blessing this day.

World Day of the Sick 2022

Message from Pope Francis

Pope Francis entitles his message this year "Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful" (Lk 6:36). Standing beside those who suffer on a path of charity.

"Jesus' invitation to be 'merciful like the Father' - writes the Pope - has particular significance for healthcare workers. I think of all those physicians, nurses, laboratory technicians, the support staff and the caretakers of the sick, as well as the numerous volunteers who donate their precious time to assist those who suffer". People who have made their service a mission. Because Your hands, which touch the suffering flesh of Christ, can be a sign of the merciful hands of the Father".

The Pontiff recalls "the progress that medical science has made, especially in recent times; new technologies have made it possible to prepare therapies that are of great benefit to the sick; research continues to make a valuable contribution to eliminating old and new pathologies; rehabilitation medicine has greatly expanded its expertise and skills. None of this, however, must make us forget the uniqueness of each patient, his or her dignity and frailties".

However, He issues a warning and calls for the patient to always be treated as a person with his or her own dignity. "None of this, however, must make us forget the uniqueness of each patient, his or her dignity and frailties. Patients are always more important than their diseases, and for this reason, no therapeutic approach can prescind from listening to the patient, his or her history, anxieties and fears. Even when healing is not possible, care can always be given. It is always possible to console, it is always possible to make people sense a closeness that is more interested in the person than in his or her pathology".

The Holy Father reaffirms the importance of Catholic healthcare institutions and their commitment to caring for and treating people. "At a time in which the culture of waste is widespread and life is not always acknowledged as worthy of being welcomed and lived, these structures, like "houses of mercy", can be exemplary in protecting and caring for all life, even the most fragile, from its beginning until its natural end". Finally, He concludes by recalling the indispensable service of the health care ministry, especially in spiritual assistance to the sick, and the commitment that each of us should have in making ourselves close to those who suffer. Because "the ministry of consolation is a task for every baptized person, mindful of the word of Jesus: "I was sick and you visited me" (Mt 25:36).

Dear brothers and sisters, to the intercession of Mary, Health of the Infirm, I entrust all the sick and their families. United with Christ, who bears the pain of the world, may they find meaning, consolation and trust. I pray for healthcare workers everywhere, that, rich in mercy, they may offer patients, together with suitable care, their fraternal closeness.

To all I cordially impart my Apostolic Blessing.
